Come for the Ride!!

This is our “no frills” weekend ride. The Montebello Fire & Rescue Co (MVF&R) will provide wonderful trails, and a primitive camping space for you and your horse. Riders are responsible for their own food.

Here’s the plan:

Register and pay in advance. Arrive on Friday Oct 8th after 1:00 p.m. The camping facilities are primitive but there is plenty of space for your rig and a 10x12 area for a horse lot. Restrooms with shower facilities are available at the fire station. Field water is available for the horses.

Sat. morning the fire & rescue crew will be cooking applebutter over an outdoor fire. Courtesy coffee will be available at the fire station to get you charged up for the ride. The Saturday ride is about 15 miles. We will have a more accurate mileage after it is marked. Trails are self-guided so you can go at your own pace

Sunday morning there will an opportunity to sample the applebutter with a warm biscuit and coffee before taking a short ride (@10 miles)

The cost is \$50/rider. A registration form is attached. Each rider should complete a separate form. Please, complete the form, sign and date the release portion, and mail with your check and a copy of your coggins. (If Coggins not valid at time of registration, please, bring an current copy with you.) Mail to Montebello Vol. Fire & Rescue Co; P.O. Box 96, Montebello, VA 24464

Montebello is located at the crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains in Nelson County. The fire station is at the intersection of state routes 56 & 667. The address is 119 Fork Mountain Lane.

Highway 56 is a winding, two-lane road which runs both east and west of the fire station. Montebello is 8.5 miles from route 11 to the west and 22 miles from rout 29 to the east.

A scenic and flatter approach is on the Blue Ridge Parkway. Exit at milepost 29 onto route 813 (Whetstone Ridge Rd), in .1 mile turn left on route 603 (Irish Creek Rd.) in .2 miles turn right onto route 56. In about 3 miles you will see the village of Montebello. Turn left onto route 667 (Fork Mtn. La.)

A couple words of caution: Do not rely on a GPS to get you here. A cell phone is unreliable. You may use our office phone for emergencies and people can contact you for emergencies at 540 377-2145 (day) or 540 377-5712 (night)
